## Public Health/COVID-19 Omni Questions <br> Prepared by RAD, May 2020

## Summary

- There is broad approval across all measured demographics for both local elected officials and public health officials.
- $68 \%$ of respondents approved of local elected leaders' response to the COVID-19 crisis.
- Republicans (72\%) and males (79\%) were most likely to approve, by small margins.
- Rural, Urban, and Suburban locales were identical in their approval ratings at 68\%.
- $75 \%$ of respondents approved of local health officials' response to the COVID-19 crisis.
- Democrats ( $81 \%$ ) and males ( $83 \%$ ) were most likely to approve, by small/medium margins.
- Urban locales approved more (80\%) than rural locales (69\%).
- $80 \%$ of respondents agreed that stay-at-home orders had kept them and their communities safe.
