
DRUG OVERDOSE DEATHS IN BIG CITIES: 2010-2021



IN BIG CITIES, OVERDOSE DEATHS ROSE BY 235% FROM 2010 TO 2021

Since 2010, over **100,000** people in large U.S. cities have died from a drug overdose.

SYNTHETICS LIKE FENTANYL DROVE OPIOID DEATHS




In **2010**, synthetic opioids caused **1 in 10** opioid overdose deaths.

By **2021**, this increased to **9 in 10** due to an influx of fentanyl, a highly lethal synthetic opioid.

IN BIG CITIES, DEATH RATES ROSE SHARPLY IN ALL RACIAL AND ETHNIC GROUPS

In **2010**, the overdose death rate was highest among white people.

By **2021**, Black people had the highest rate of overdose death. In this group of people, deaths were 4x higher than in 2010.
